## **MINUTES**

May 14<sup>th</sup> Registration 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Social Hour 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

May 15<sup>th</sup> The 62<sup>nd</sup> Annual General Meeting and Convention of the Senior Citizens' Association was called to order by President Gale Detta at 9:00 a.m.

The assembly sang O'Canada followed by the Seniors Prayer. A minute of silence was observed in honour of deceased members and friends.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Payment for Website: Moved by the Administrative Assistant, seconded by 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-President that the Senior Citizens' Association of B.C. accept the recommendation of the Executive Board to Pay \$500.84 for the development and set-up of the new website. Carried.
- 2. Historical Items: Moved by Beaver Valley Branch 44, seconded by Grand Forks Branch 68 that the Senior Citizens' Association of B.C. investigate the possibility of having the historical data digitalized, and that following this investigation, including the cost, be placed before the 2016 AGM for approval. Carried.
- 3. Title for Land and Building: Moved by 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-President, Ralph White, seconded by Secretary/Treasurer, Warren Collinson, that the Land and Building at 49<sup>th</sup> Street NE, Canoe, B.C. Lot 1 Section 6 Township 21 Range 9 west of the 6<sup>th</sup> meridian. Kamloops Division. Yale District Plan 25659. Be Gifted by The Senior Citizens Association of British Columbia back to the Canoe Seniors Association, Branch 92. Carried.
- 4. Bursary: Moved by Passmore Branch 116, seconded by Princeton Branch 30, that we create a bursary in the B.C. Senior Citizens' Association of B.C. from a portion of the membership fees from branches, to help small branches with expenses to attend AGM's.
  Motion to table to the 2016 AGM Moved by Cranbrook Branch 11, seconded by Kimberley Branch 14. Carried.
